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AGE PROFILE

Has the age profile of Playford changed over the last 5 years?

The number of persons enumerated in Playford increased from 63,375 in 1996 to 66,757 in 2001, an increase of 5.3%.

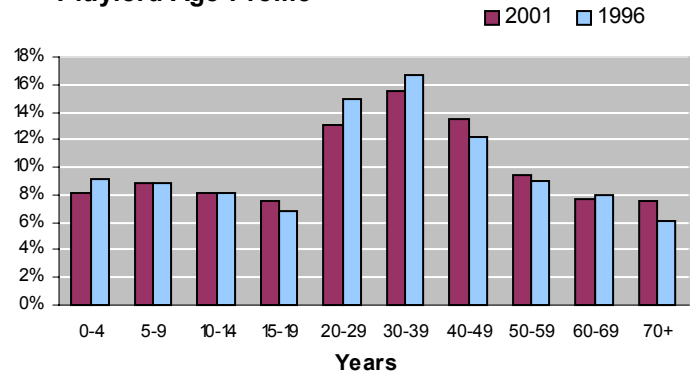
The median age for males increased from 30 years in 1996 to 32 years in 2001, whilst the median age for females increased from 31 years to 33 years.

The most significant change in the age profile for Playford was the number of persons aged 70 years and over, increasing from 3,842 in 1996 to 5,108 in 2001, a 33% increase.

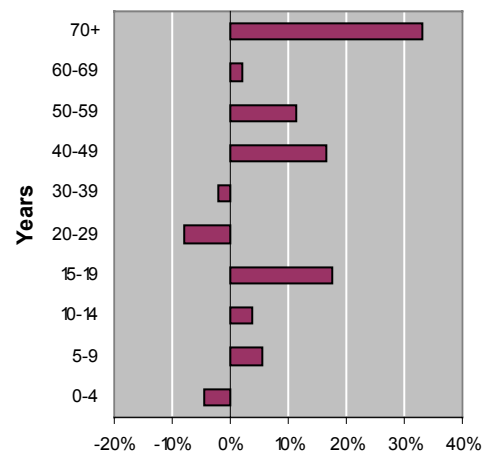
The number of persons aged under 20 years has increased by 5% from 20,901 in 1996 to 21,931 in 2001.

This increase is despite a reduction of 4% in the number of 0-4 year olds. In the last 5 years the population of 0-4 year olds has dropped from 5,755 persons to 5,505 persons.

How does the age profile of Playford compare with the Adelaide metropolitan area?

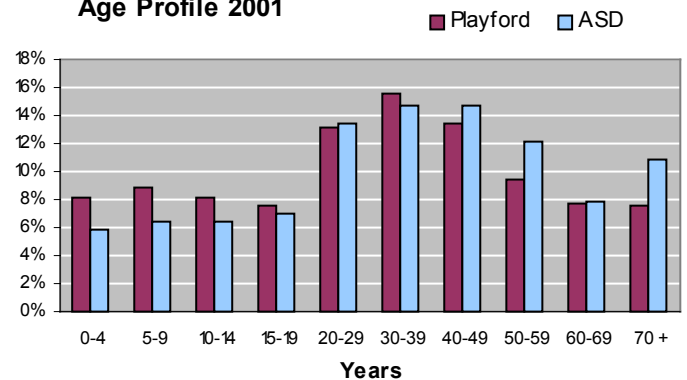
The median male age for Playford is 32 years compared with 35 years for the Adelaide metropolitan area.

The median female age for Playford is 33 years compared with 38 years for the Adelaide metropolitan area.

Playford has a younger age profile than the metropolitan area with 33% of people aged under 20 years compared to 26% for Adelaide.

Playford also has a smaller percentage of aged persons with a quarter of the Playford population aged over 50 years compared to nearly 31% for the metropolitan area.

FAMILIES

Have families in Playford changed over the last 5 years?

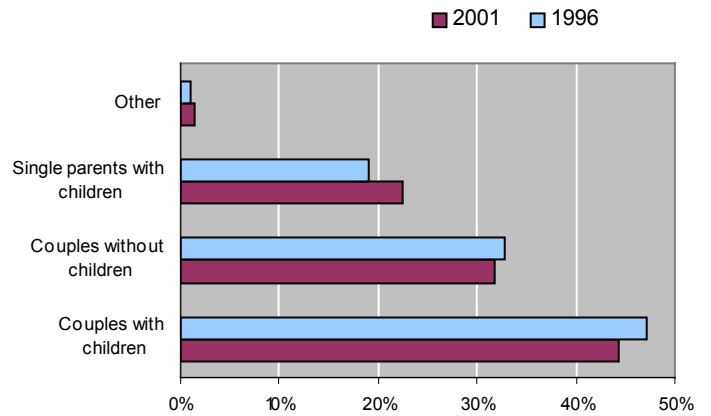
The number of families increased from 17,345 in 1996 to 18,316 in 2001, an increase of 5.6% over the last 5 years.

There were 5,898 couples with children under 15 in 2001 compared to 6,095 in 1996, a decrease of 3.2%.

Over the last 5 years there has been an increase in the number of single parents in Playford. Single parents represented 19% of all families in 1996 compared with 22.4 % in 2001.

The number of single parents with children under 15 increased from 2,273 in 1996 to 2,811 in 2001, an increase of 23.7%.

Families in Playford

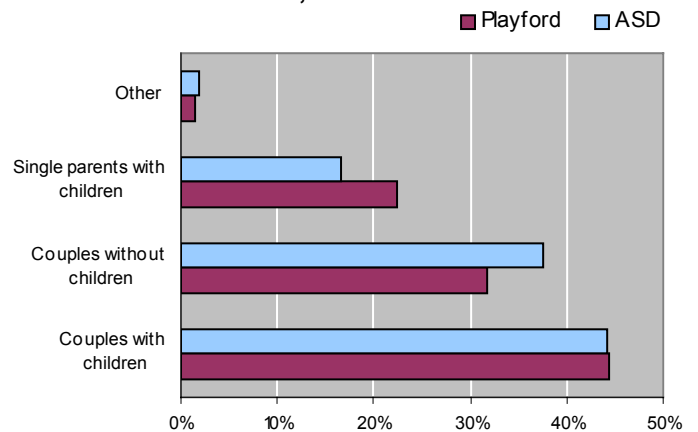


Are Playford families different to families in the Adelaide metropolitan area?

Playford has a higher incidence of single parent families. These families represent 22.4% of all families in Playford compared to 16.6% for Adelaide.

Adelaide has a higher incidence of couples without children. These families represent 37.5% of all families in Adelaide compared with 32% for Playford.

WEEKLY INDIVIDUAL INCOME

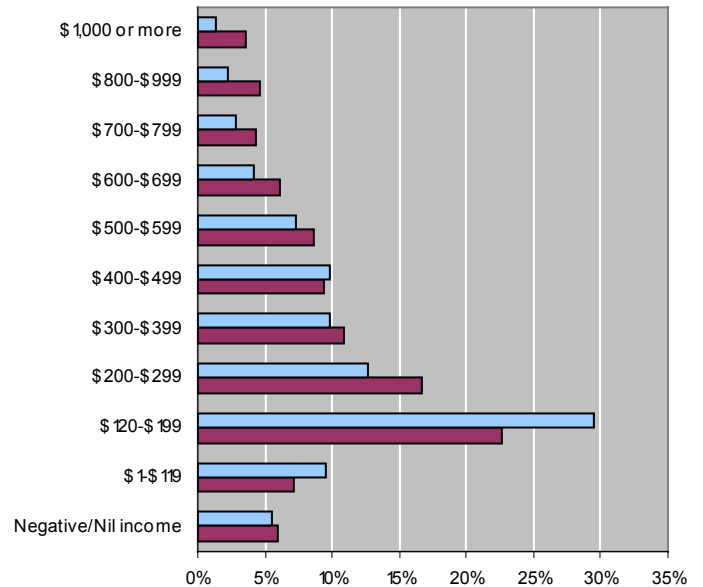
Has Playford's income distribution changed over the last 5 years?

The median weekly individual income for Playford residents in 2001 was \$285 compared with \$220 in 1996.

In 2001, 36% (17,000) of residents aged 15 years and over earned less than \$200 a week compared with 47% in 1996.

Over 27% (12,800) of residents earned a weekly income of \$500 or more in 2001 compared with 19% five years ago.

Playford Income Distribution 2001 1996



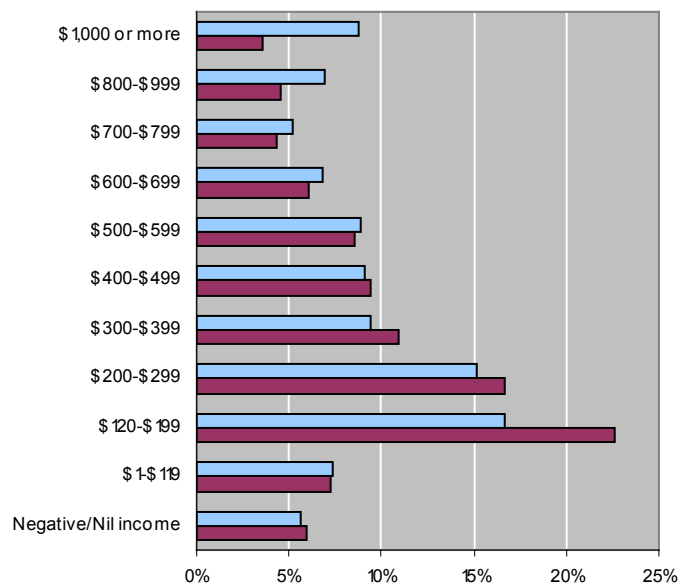
Is the income distribution of Playford different to the Adelaide metropolitan area?

Playford has a higher percentage of people earning less than \$200 a week (36%) compared with Adelaide (30%).

Conversely, only 27% of the Playford population earned \$500 or more a week compared with 37% for Adelaide.

The median weekly individual income for Playford in 2001 was \$285 compared with \$355 for Adelaide.

WEEKLY HOUSEHOLD INCOME

Has the income distribution of Playford households changed over the last 5 years?

The median weekly household income for Playford in 2001 was \$580 compared with \$480 in 1996.

44% (9,800) of Playford households earned less than \$500 a week in 2001 compared with 52% in 1996.

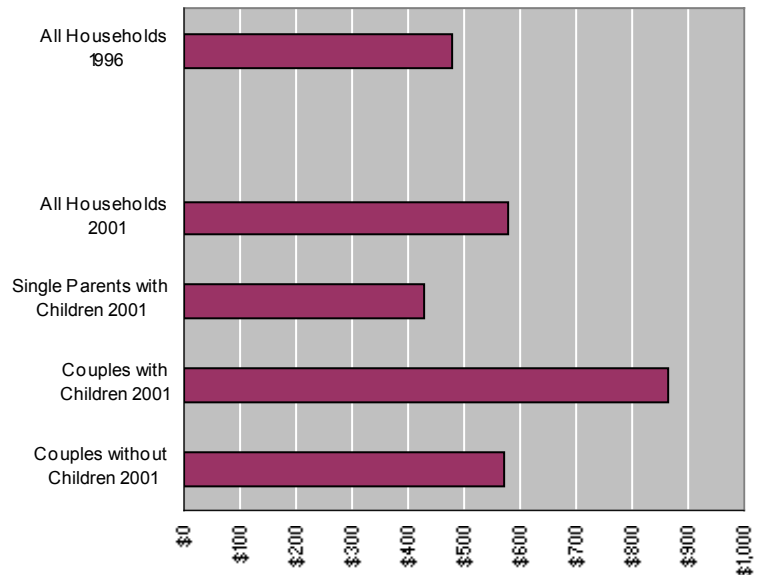
23% (5,200) of Playford households earned more than \$1,000 a week in 2001 compared with 14% in 1996.

In 2001, the median income for couples with children was \$865 with 62% (4,600) of these families earning over \$800 a week.

This was much higher than the median income of \$575 for couples without children. Only 33% (1,850) of these families earned more than \$800 a week.

As expected, the median income for single parent families was much lower at \$430.

Median Weekly Household Income



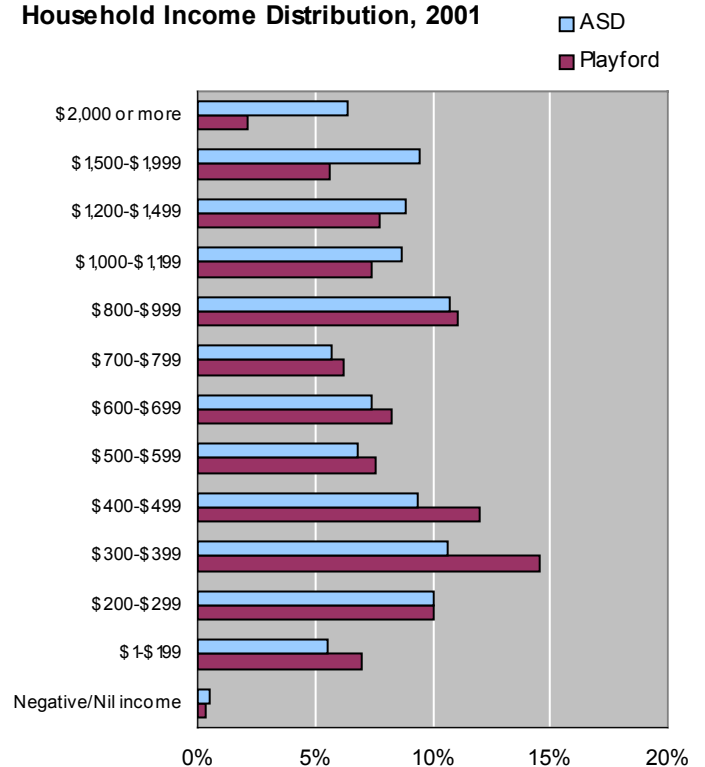
Do Playford households earn the same income as Adelaide residents?

The median weekly income for households across Adelaide was nearly \$700, much higher than Playford's median of \$580.

44% of Playford households earned less than \$500 per week compared with 36% of Adelaide residents.

Only 23% of Playford households earned more than \$1,000 per week compared with 33% of Adelaide residents.

EDUCATION

What type of schools do Playford children attend?

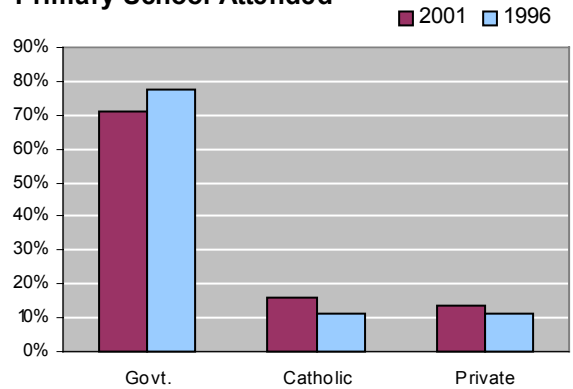
12.8% (8,540) of Playford's population attended primary school in 2001.

Over the last 5 years there has been a shift from Government primary schools to Catholic or private schools, with 29% (2,490) of primary school children attending non-Government schools in 2001 compared with 22% (1,860) in 1996.

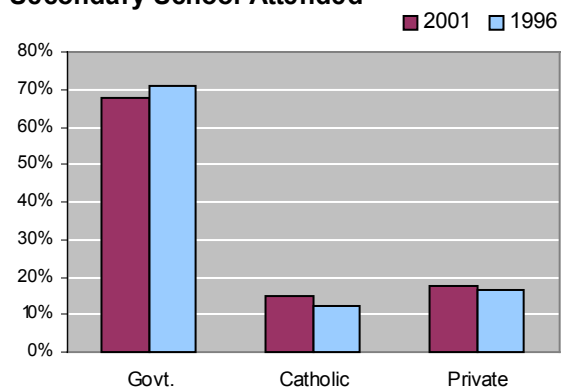
This trend continues in secondary schooling with 32% (1,400) of school children attending non-Government schools in 2001 compared with 29% (1,065) in 1996.

6.5% (4,330) of Playford's population attended secondary school in 2001.

Secondary School Attended

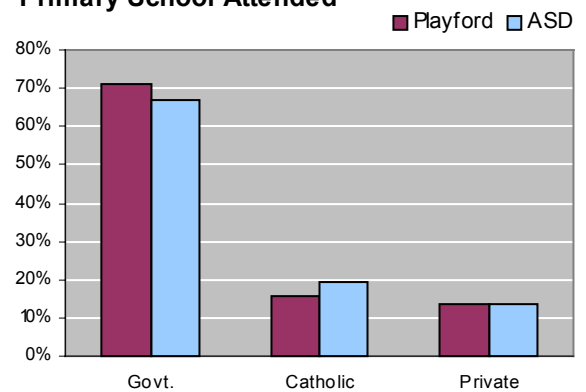


How does Playford compare with the Adelaide metropolitan area?

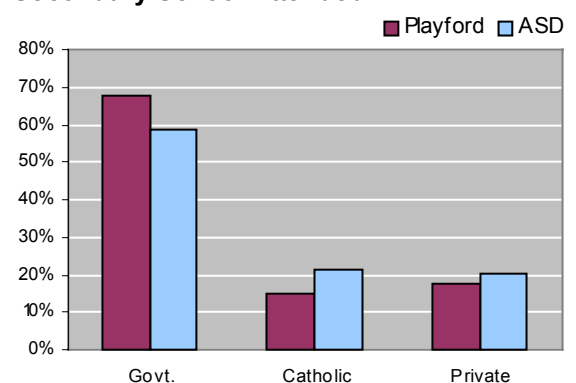
33% of primary school children in Adelaide attended either a Catholic or private school compared with 29% in Playford.

The difference in participation is more significant in secondary schooling with 41% of children in Adelaide attending a private or Catholic school compared with 32% in Playford.

Secondary School Attended



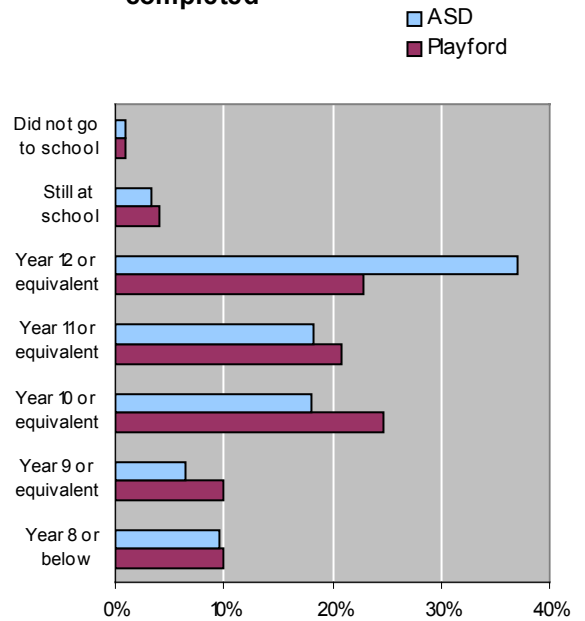
EDUCATION

How long do Playford residents stay at school?

44% (22,150) of Playford residents aged 15 years and over have not completed more than three years of secondary schooling compared with 34% for Adelaide.

23% (11,425) of Playford residents aged 15 years and over have completed Year 12 compared with 37% for Adelaide.

Highest level of schooling completed



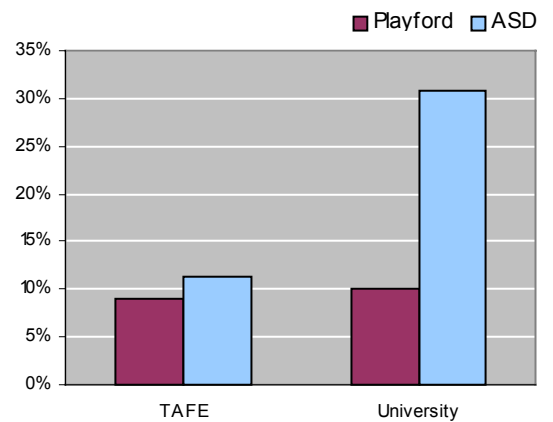
Are Playford residents undertaking further education?

9.0% (245) of Playfords population aged 19 to 21 years attended TAFE education in 2001. This participation rate was the second lowest of all metropolitan Councils.

The average metropolitan participation rate in TAFE education was 11.3%.

Playford had the lowest university participation rate of all metropolitan Councils in 2001. 10.0% (274) of Playford's 19 to 21 year olds attended University compared with 30.8% for the metropolitan area.

Participation in Tertiary Education 19 to 21 Year Olds



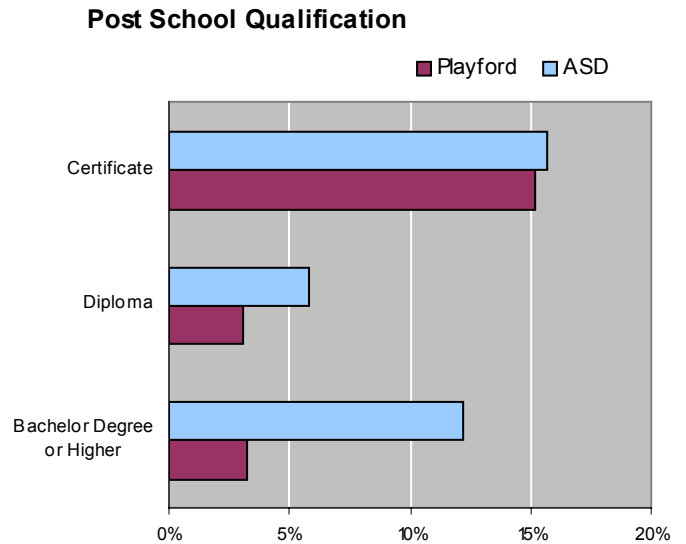
EDUCATION

What post-school qualifications do Playford residents have?

Only 3.2% (1,587) of Playford residents aged 15 years and over have completed a Bachelor Degree or higher. This compares with 12.2% for Adelaide residents.

3.1% (1,531) of Playford residents have completed a Diploma compared with 5.8% for Adelaide residents.

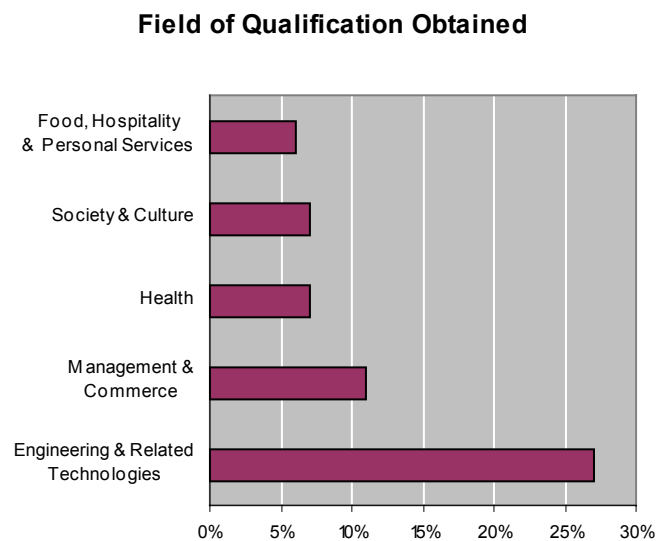
Playford residents were just as likely to have obtained a Certificate (I, II, III, or IV) qualification as residents in the metropolitan area. 15% (7,565) of residents aged 15 years and over have completed a Certificate qualification.



In what fields of study were these qualifications obtained?

The most common fields of study these qualifications were obtained in were Engineering (27% or 4,094 persons), Management & Commerce (11% or 1,660 persons), Health (7% or 1,139 persons) and Society & Culture (7% or 1,021 persons).

These were also the most common fields of study for the rest of Adelaide.



COMPUTER & INTERNET USAGE

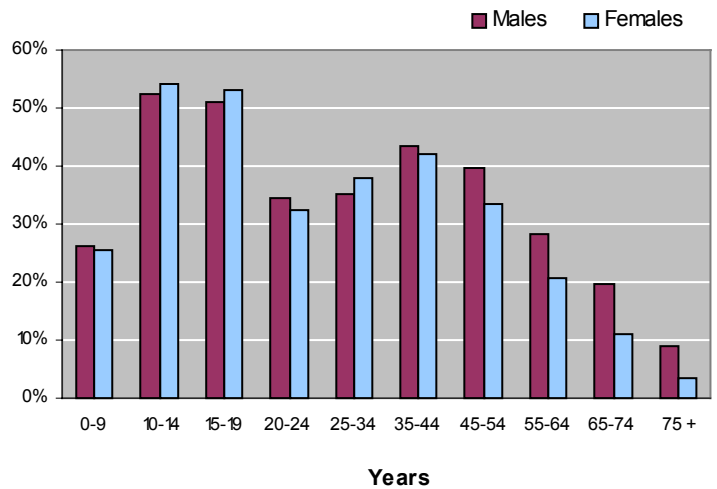
Do Playford residents regularly use a home computer?

Residents aged 10-19 years are more likely to regularly use a home computer than any other age group.

There is little difference between home computer usage by males and females aged less than 45 years.

Males aged 45 years and over are more likely to use a computer at home than females in this age group.

Home Computer Usage

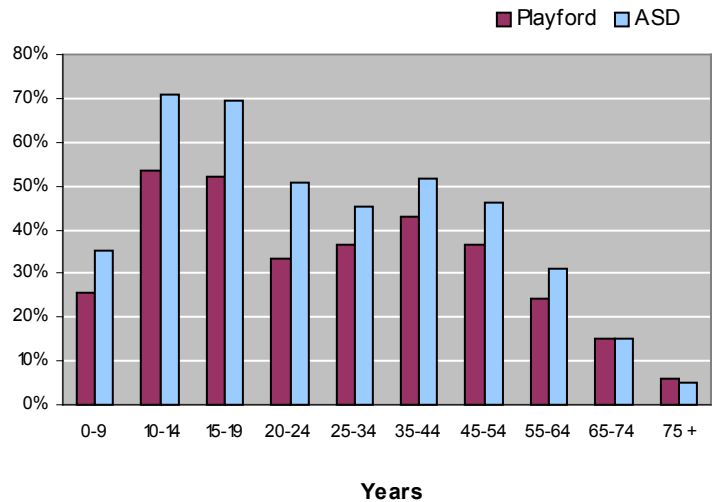


How does home computer usage in Playford compare with the Adelaide metropolitan area?

26% (2,950) of Playford children under 10 years old regularly use a home computer compared with 35% for Adelaide.

53% (5,540) of Playford children aged 10-19 years use a home computer compared with 70% for Adelaide.

Home Computer Usage

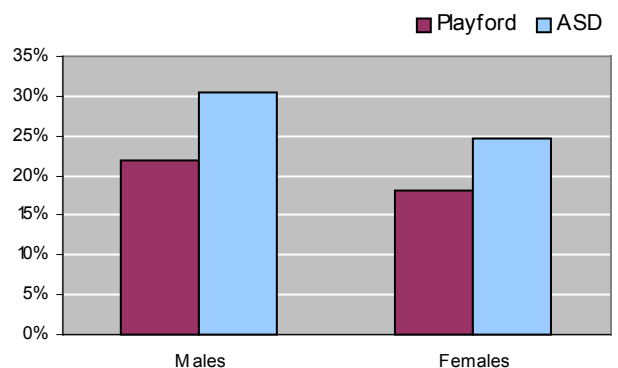


How does home Internet usage in Playford compare with the Adelaide metropolitan area?

22% (7,235) of males in Playford regularly use the Internet at home compared with 30% for Adelaide.

18% (6,150) of Playford's female residents regularly use the Internet at home compared with 25% for Adelaide.

BIRTHPLACE, LANGUAGE & RELIGION

Where were Playford residents born?

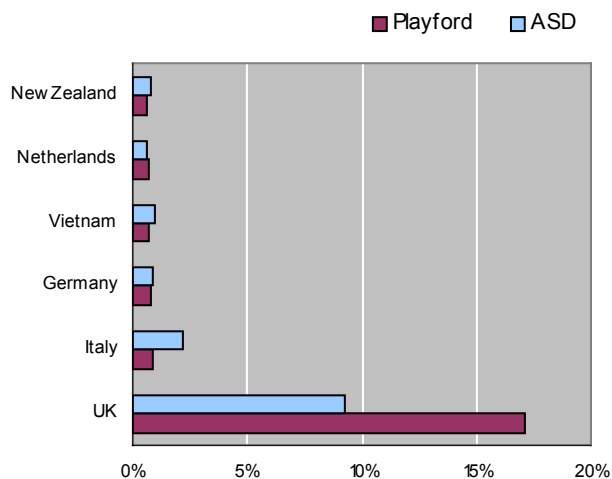
70% (46,570) of people living in Playford were born in Australia compared with 68% (43,070) in 1996.

The proportion of residents born in the UK decreased from 20% (12,730) in 1996 to 17% (11,475) in 2001.

The most common countries of birth for the remaining residents were Italy (0.9% or 570 persons), Germany (0.8% or 515), Vietnam (0.7% or 485), the Netherlands (0.7% or 480), and New Zealand (0.6% or 430), similar to 5 years ago.

The main difference between the birthplace of Playford residents and the Adelaide metropolitan area is the high percentage of Playford residents born in the UK (17%) compared with 9% for Adelaide.

Of the 16,950 Playford residents born overseas, 81% speak English only.

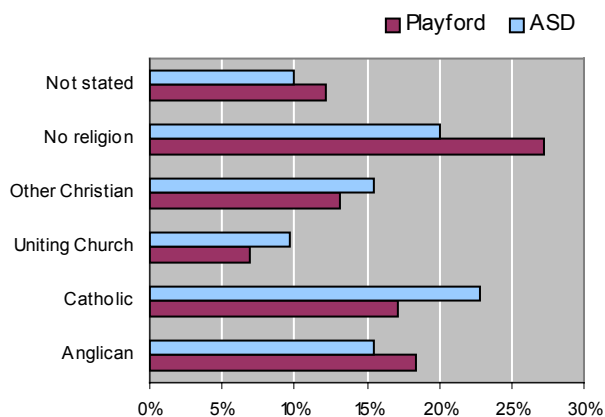
23% of the 3,170 residents who speak another language had difficulty speaking English, the same proportion as the Adelaide metropolitan area.

Religion

27% (18,200) of Playford's residents stated they were not religious compared with 20% in the Adelaide metropolitan area.

Christianity was the most common religion in Playford with 56% of residents stating they were Christians compared with 63% in Adelaide. Anglican, Catholic and Uniting Church were nominated as the most common Christian religions.

HOUSING

What type of dwellings do Playford residents live in?

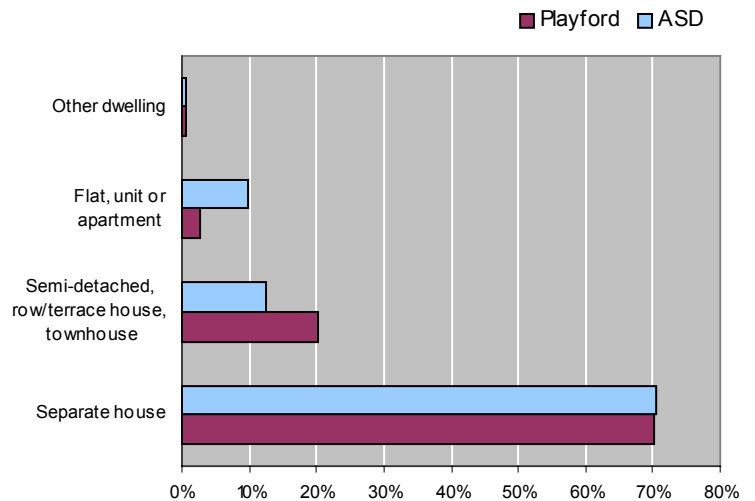
Over the last 5 years Playford's total housing stock has increased by over 5% to 26,150 dwellings. 5% (1,345) of these dwellings were unoccupied.

Separate houses made up 70% of Playford's total housing stock (18,375 dwellings), the same proportion as the Adelaide metropolitan area.

The main difference between Playford and Adelaide was the higher proportion of semi-detached houses in Playford (20% or 5,305 dwellings) compared with 12.5% in Adelaide.

Nearly 80% of Playford's population live in separate houses (compared with 83% in Adelaide) and 18% live in semi-detached houses (compared with 10% in Adelaide).

Is home ownership in Playford similar to the Adelaide metropolitan area?

Playford residents are less likely to fully own their homes with 26% (6,380) of Playford's dwellings fully owned compared with 39% in Adelaide.

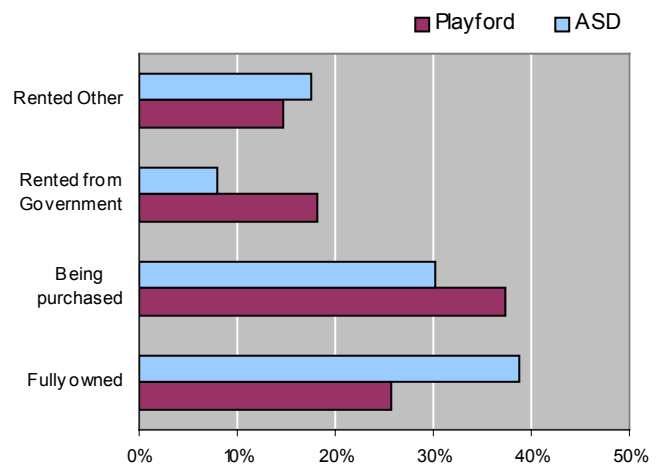
Playford has a much higher proportion of dwellings rented from the Housing Trust (18%) than the Adelaide average (8%).

Nearly 4,500 dwellings in Playford are rented from the Housing Trust. Of these dwellings 66% are semi-detached, 23% are separate houses and 10% are flats/units.

32% (5,860) of separate houses in Playford are fully owned, and 47% (8,550) are being purchased.

56% (2,965) of semi-detached houses in Playford are rented from the Government, and 22% (1,165) are rented privately.

Home Ownership



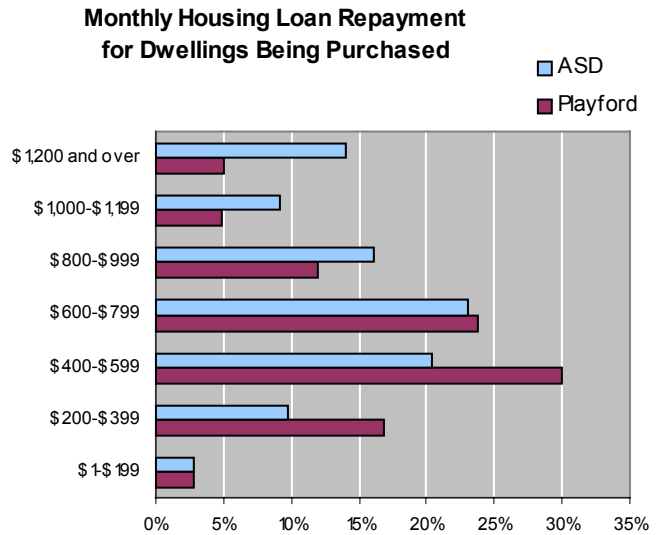
HOUSING

Monthly Housing Loan Repayment for Dwellings Being Purchased

In 2001, the median monthly housing loan repayment was approximately \$585, just over \$145 per week.

This compares with \$730 (just over \$180 per week) for the Adelaide metropolitan area.

30% of the 9,260 dwellings being purchased had a monthly loan repayment between \$400 and \$599, equivalent to between \$100 and \$150 a week.

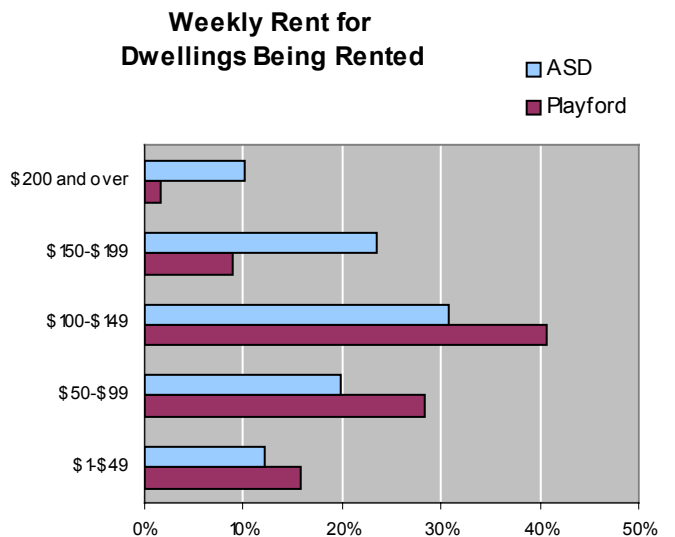


Weekly Rent for Dwellings Being Rented

In 2001, the median weekly rent paid in Playford was approximately \$105.

This compares with \$125 for the Adelaide metropolitan area.

The weekly rent for over 40% of the 8,150 dwellings being rented in Playford was between \$100 and \$149.



HOUSING

Housing Rates

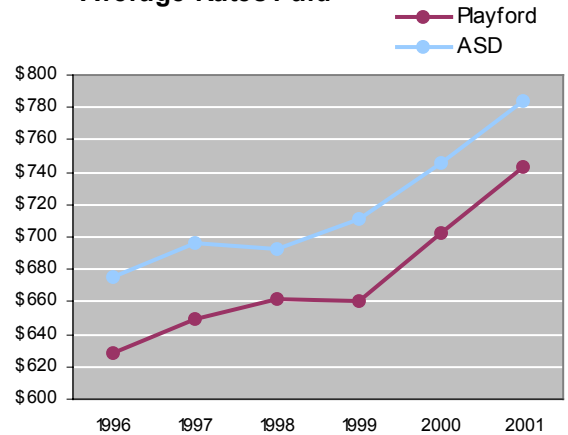
Over the last 5 years the average housing rate paid by Playford residents increased by 18% from \$628 in 1996 to \$743 in 2001.

This increase was slightly higher than the metropolitan average increase of 16% over this time period.

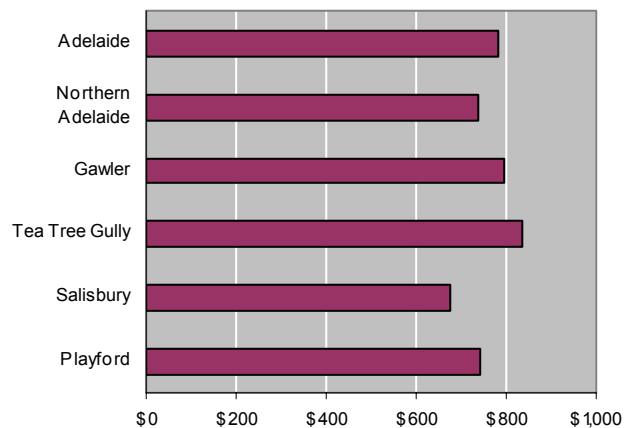
However, Playford residents continued to pay lower rates (\$743) than the metropolitan average (\$784) in 2001.

Of the Northern Adelaide LGA's only Salisbury residents paid lower rates.

Average Rates Paid \$



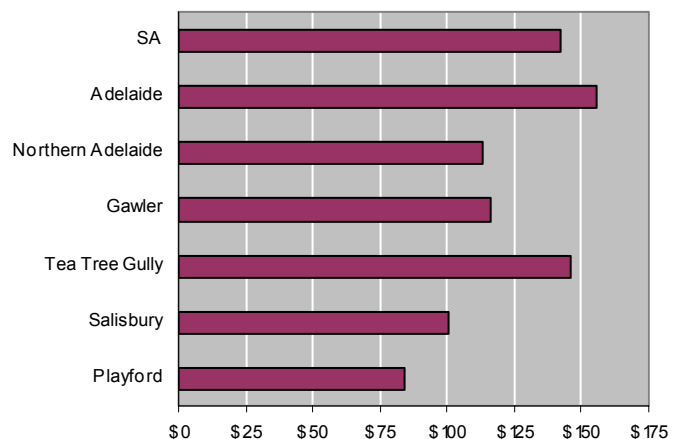
Residential Property Sales

The number of residential property sales in Playford increased from 1,105 in 1996 to 1,699 in 2001, an increase of 54% over 5 years

The average value of residential property sales in Playford increased from \$72,500 in 1996 to \$83,800 in 2001, an increase of 16% over 5 years. This change was much lower than the metropolitan average increase of 28%.

In 2001, Playford had the lowest average sale price of all Northern Adelaide LGA's (\$83,800) and was significantly lower than the average sale price across Adelaide (\$155,800).

INDIGENOUS PROFILE

Age

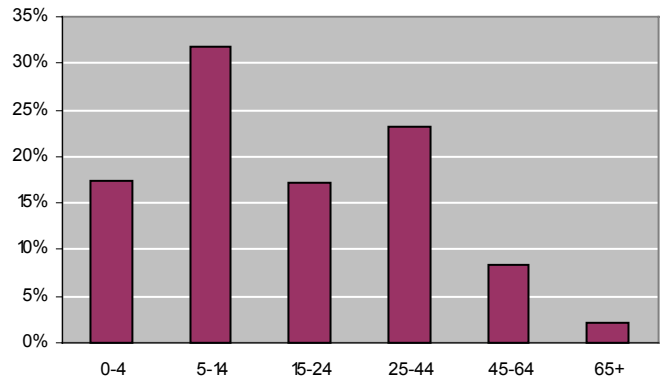
There were 1,532 Indigenous residents living in Playford in 2001, an increase of 414 persons since 1996.

In 2001, Indigenous persons represented 2.3% of the Playford population compared with 1.8% in 1996, and 1.4% in 1991. Indigenous persons represented 1% of the population in the Adelaide metropolitan area in 2001.

The age profile of Indigenous residents is much younger than non-Indigenous residents with 66% (1,018) of Indigenous residents aged under 24 years and 89% (1,373) aged under 45 years.

Only 2% (32) of the Indigenous population is aged over 65 years.

Families

There were 352 Indigenous families in Playford in 2001.

44% (155) of these families were couple families with children, 40% (140) were single parent families with children, and 13% (45) were couples without children.

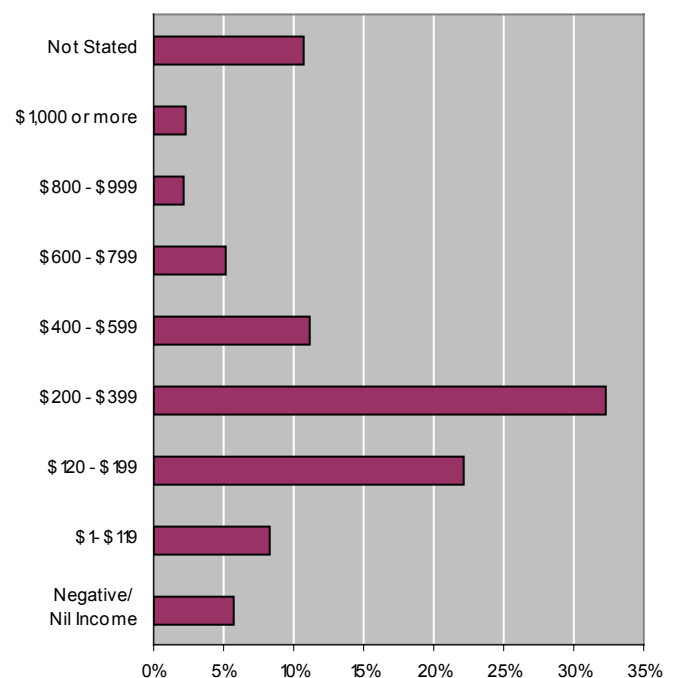
70% (245) of all Indigenous families had at least one child under 15 years.

Income

The median income for Indigenous residents in 2001 was approximately \$255 per week.

36% (280 persons) of the Indigenous population aged 15 years and over earned less than \$200 a week, whilst 32% (250) earned between \$200 and \$400 per week.

Highest level of secondary schooling completed

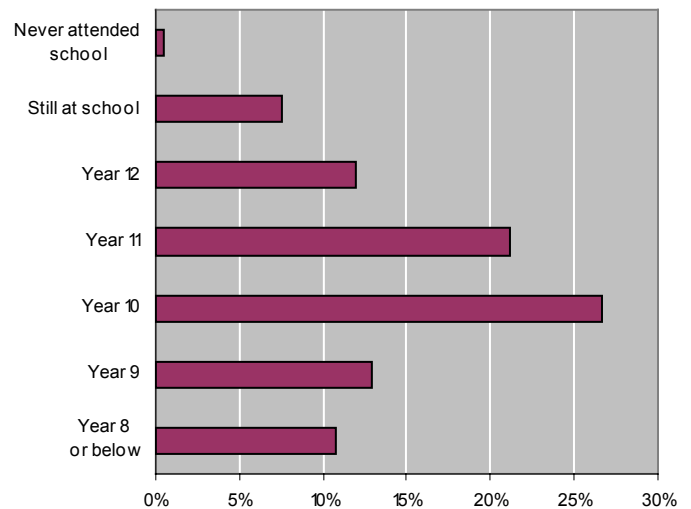
50% (390) of Playford's Indigenous residents have not completed more than 3 years of secondary schooling.

12% (93) have completed Year 12.

Further Education

3.3% (50) of Indigenous residents attended TAFE in 2001 and 0.9% (14) attended University.

Computer & Internet Usage

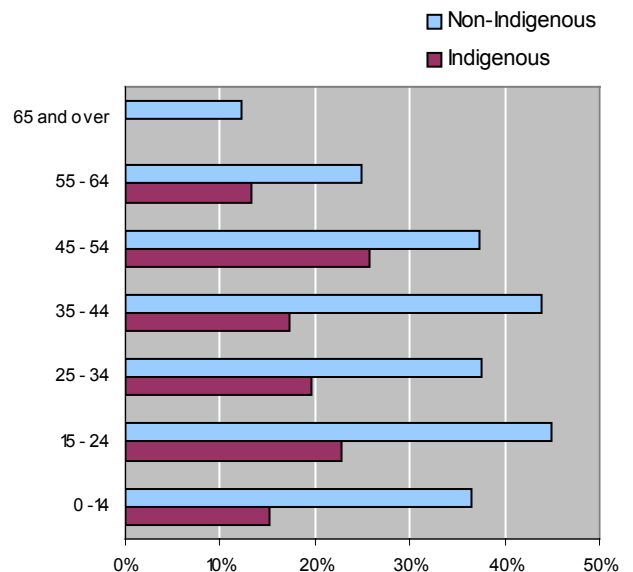
15.2% (115) of Indigenous persons under 15 regularly use a home computer compared with 36.4% for non-Indigenous persons.

Home computer usage by Indigenous persons is much lower for all age groups than for non-Indigenous persons.

Indigenous residents are less likely to use the Internet with only 15% (225) accessing the Internet in the week prior to the Census compared with 28% for non-Indigenous residents.

7% (104) of Indigenous residents regularly use the Internet at home compared with 21% of non-Indigenous residents.

Religion

Christianity was nominated as the most popular religion for Indigenous people (46% or 703 persons), whilst 36% (549) stated they were not religious.

LABOUR FORCE

Unemployment Rate

Playford's unemployment rate in 2001 was 14.1%, a significant reduction from the rate of 17.4% five years ago.

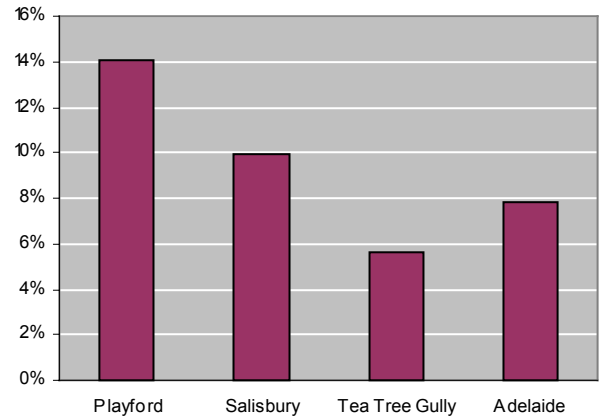
Of the 3,710 residents who were unemployed, 2,350 (63%) were male and 1,360 (37%) were female.

Unemployed males were more likely to be seeking full-time work (88% or 2079 males) than females (65% or 890 females).

Unemployment was highest in the younger age groups (15-19 year olds) with a youth unemployment rate of 27.5% (or 650 persons). Over 70% of these youth were looking for full-time work (467 persons).

The Adelaide metropolitan area had a much lower overall unemployment rate of 7.8%, and lower youth unemployment rate of 18.6%.

Unemployment Rate (%)



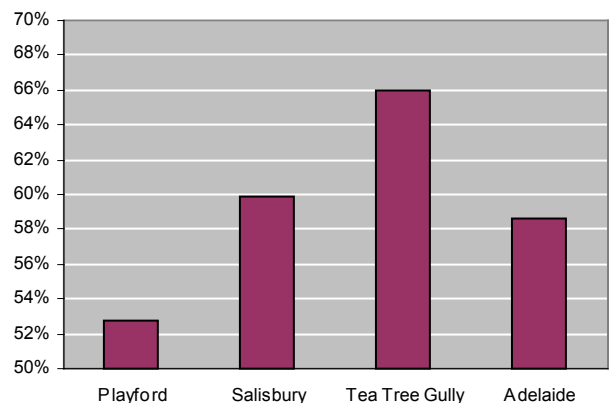
Labour Force Participation Rate

The labour force participation rate in Playford has declined from 54.4% in 1996 to 52.8% in 2001.

Males are more likely to be in the labour force with a participation rate of 63.4% (15,495 males) compared with 42.6% (10,850) for females.

The labour force participation rate for Adelaide was higher at 58.6%.

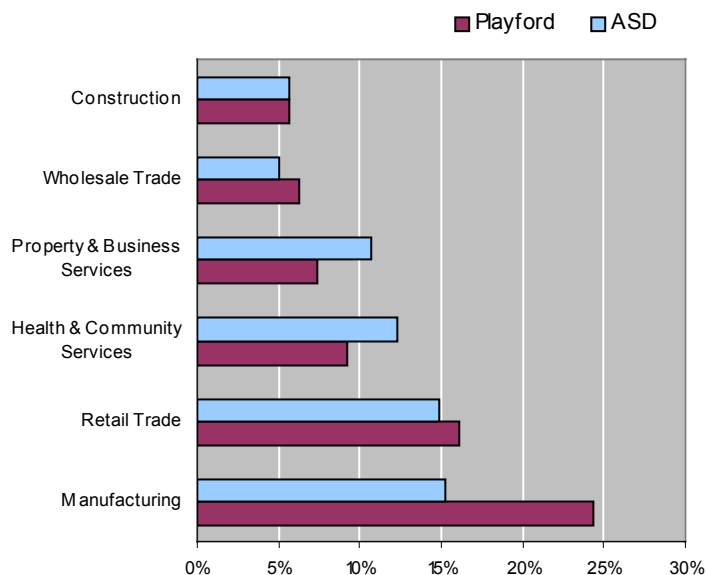
In what Industry do Playford residents work?

Nearly a quarter (5,530) of Playford's working population is employed in the Manufacturing industry compared with 15% of Adelaide residents.

The next most common industries of employment are Retail Trade (16% or 3,640), Health & Community Services (9% or 2,080), and Property & Business Services (7% or 1,665).

Playford residents were less likely to be employed in the Education industry (4% or 930) than Adelaide residents (7%).

Industry Where Residents Employed



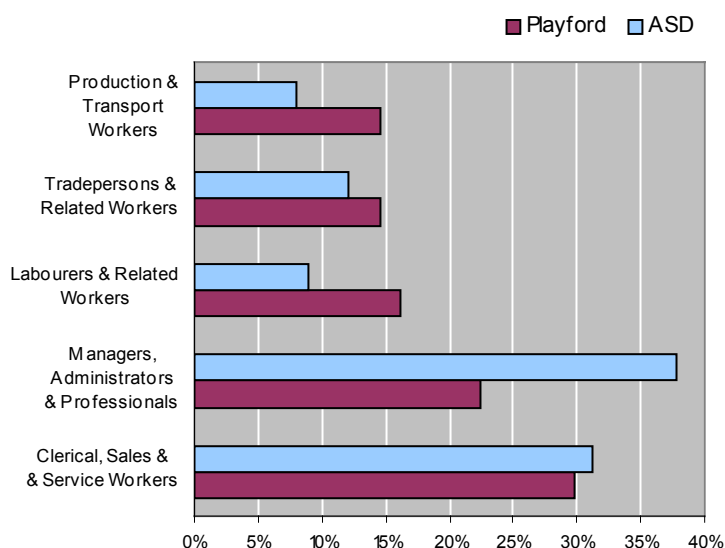
In what Occupations are Playford residents employed?

Nearly 30% (6,745) of Playford's working population are employed as Clerical, Sales or Service Workers, a similar proportion as the rest of Adelaide.

Although 22% (5,080) of Playford residents were employed as Managers, Administrators and Professionals, 38% of Adelaide residents were employed in these occupations.

Playford residents were more likely to be employed as Labourers (16% or 3,660 persons) than Adelaide residents (9%).

INCOME SUPPORT

Income Support Customers

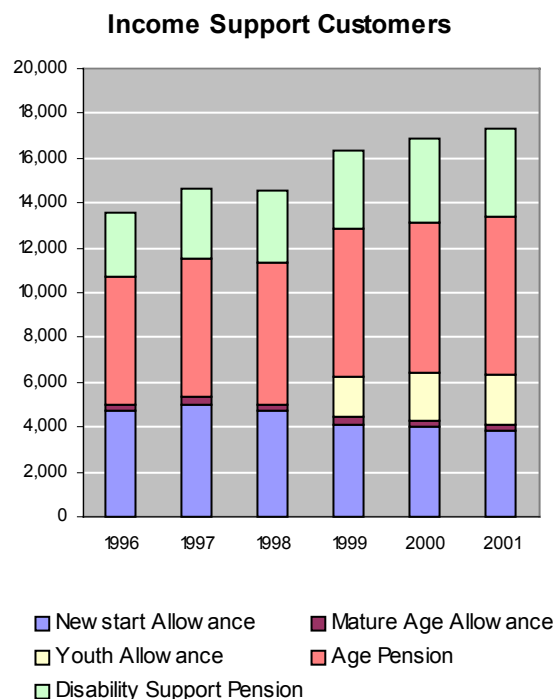
The number of Playford residents receiving an Income Support allowance or pension has been increasing steadily over the last 5 years, from 13,597 in 1996 to 17,342 in 2001.

In 1996, the number of residents receiving Income Support represented 21% of the Playford population. Of these, 8.8% received an Aged Pension, 7.2% received a Newstart Allowance (allowance for unemployed people) and 4.4% received a Disability Support Pension.

In comparison, in 2001 residents receiving Income Support represented 25% of the Playford population. Of these, 10.2% (7,046 persons) received an Age Pension, 5.8% (3,974) received a Disability Support Pension, 5.6% (3,858) received a Newstart Allowance, 3.3% (2,244) received a Youth Allowance and 0.3% (220) received a Mature Age Allowance.

In 2001, Playford residents represented 6.2% of Adelaide's population but accounted for 9.8% of residents receiving a Newstart Allowance.

The percentage of Adelaide metropolitan residents who received Income Support in 2001 was 21.5%.

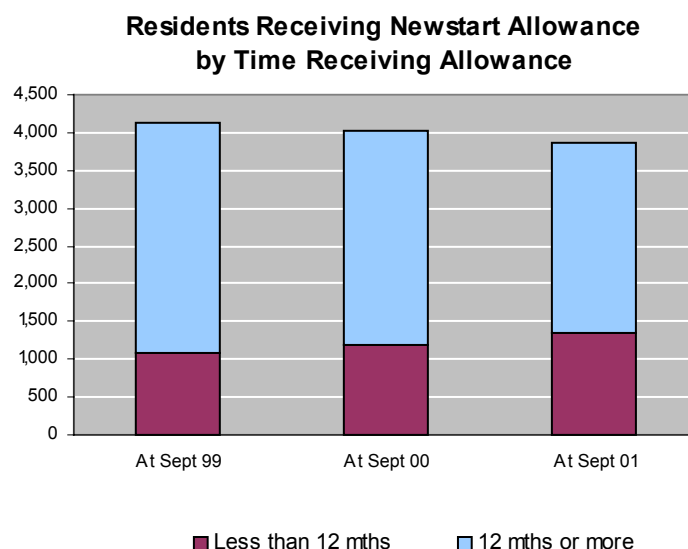


Newstart Allowance

The number of residents who have received a Newstart Allowance for more than 12 months can be used as an indicator of long term unemployment.

In September 2001, 3,858 Playford residents were receiving a Newstart Allowance and 2,508 (65%) of these residents had been receiving this allowance for more than 12 months.

The percentage of Playford residents aged 15 years and over who received a Newstart Allowance for more than 12 months declined from 6.0% at September 1999 to 4.8% at September 2001.



TRAVEL TO WORK & CAR OWNERSHIP

How did Playford residents travel to work?

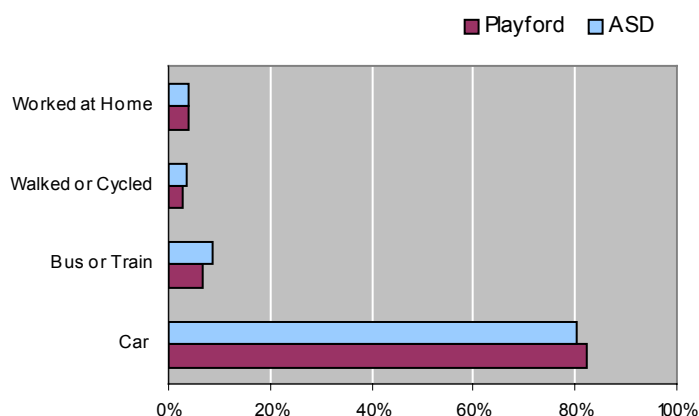
The majority of Playford's employed population travel to work by car (82% or 15,545 persons), a similar proportion to the rest of Adelaide.

Less than 7% (1,265) of workers take the train or bus to work.

Nearly 4% (720) of Playford's residents work from home, the same proportion as other Adelaide residents.

Over the last 5 there has been little change in the way Playford residents travel to work.

Car Ownership

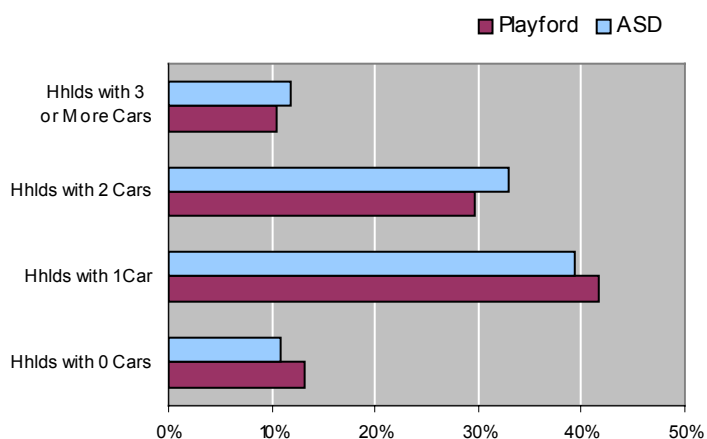
13% (3,255) of households in Playford do not own a car compared with 11% of Adelaide households.

Over the last 5 years the number of households who do not own a car has reduced from 15.5% in 1996 to 13% in 2001.

40% (9,910) of Playford households own 2 or more cars, slightly lower than the rest of Adelaide households (45%).

Over the last 5 years households owning 2 or more cars has increased from 36% in 1996 to 40%.

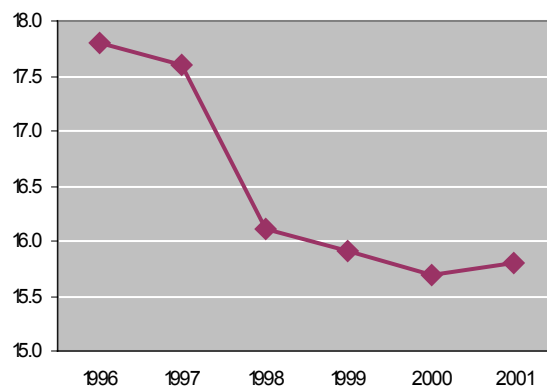
Birth Rate

Playford's birth rate per 1,000 population steadily declined from 17.8 in 1996 to 15.8 in 2001.

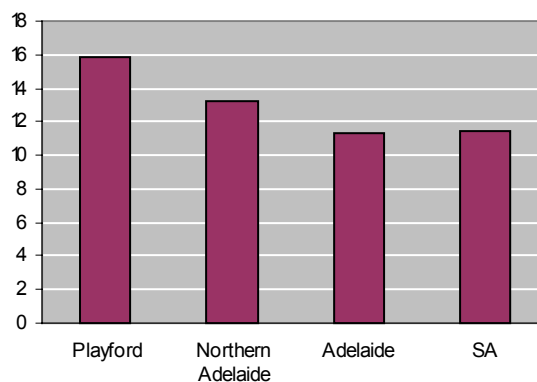
Despite this decline, Playford had a higher birth rate in 2001 than any other LGA in metropolitan Adelaide.

The average birthrate across Adelaide was 11.3 and SA, 11.5.

Crude Birth Rate



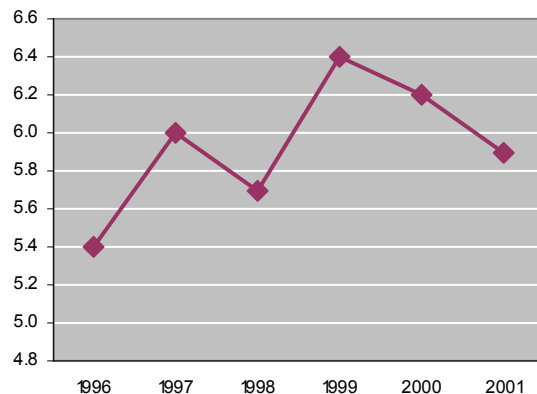

Crude Death Rate



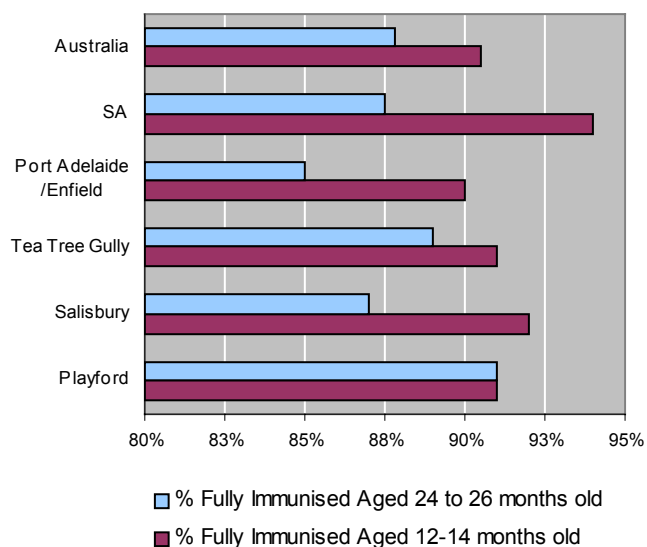
FAMILY HEALTH

Immunisation

In 2002, 91% of Playford children aged 12-14 months were fully immunised compared with an average of 94.4% across SA. The average across Australia was 90.5%.

For children aged 24-26 months old, Playford's immunisation rate was higher (91%) than the SA average (87.5%), and Australian average (87.8%).

Hospital Attendance

The number of Playford residents attending hospital has been increasing over the last 5 years from 346 per 1,000 population in 1996/97 to 371 in 2000/01.

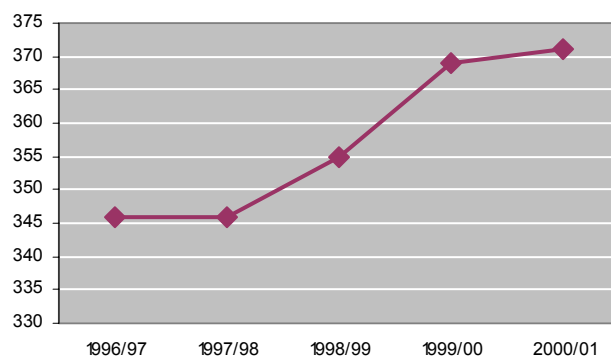
In 2000/01, Playford residents had a higher attendance rate at hospitals than the metropolitan average (371 compared with 357 per 1,000 population).

Of those Playford residents who attended hospital in 2000/01, 19.2% attended a private hospital which was similar to 5 years ago. This figure is much lower than the percentage of Adelaide residents attending private hospitals (37.6%).

In 2000/01, the hospitalisation rate for children aged 0-14 years was 233 per 1,000 population, lower than the rate five years ago (249).

The hospitalisation rate for persons aged 65 years and over was 776 per 1,000 residents, higher than the rate 5 years ago (755).

Playford Residents Attending Hospital Rate per 1,000 Population



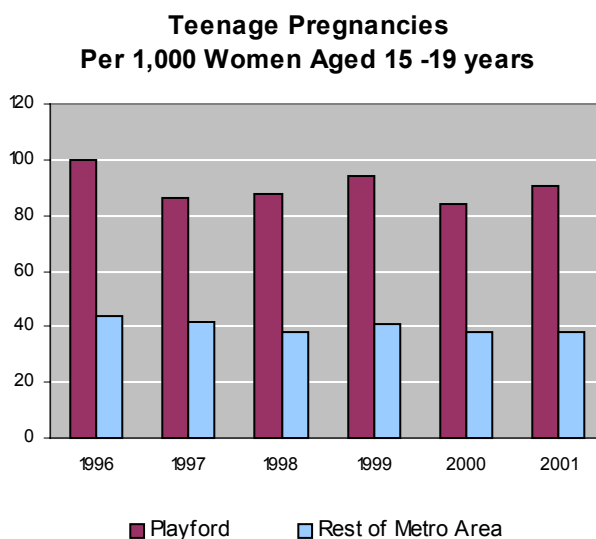
FAMILY HEALTH

Teenage Pregnancies

The incidence of teenage pregnancies in Playford was more than double the incidence in the rest of the metropolitan area.

In 2001, there were 90.4 pregnancies per 1,000 women aged 15–19 years in Playford compared with 37.8 in the remaining metropolitan area.

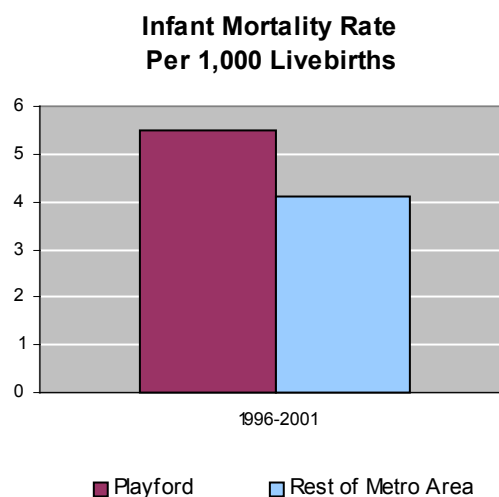
The rate of teenage pregnancies in Playford has reduced over the last 5 years from 100.2 in 1996 to 90.4 in 2001, a decrease of 10%. This compares with a reduction of 13% over this time period in the rest of the metropolitan area.



Infant Mortality

The average infant mortality rate in Playford over the time period 1996 to 2001 was 5.5 deaths per 1,000 livebirths. This was higher than the average rate in the rest of the metropolitan area (4.1 deaths per 1,000 livebirths).

Note : An infant is defined as a child under 1 year.

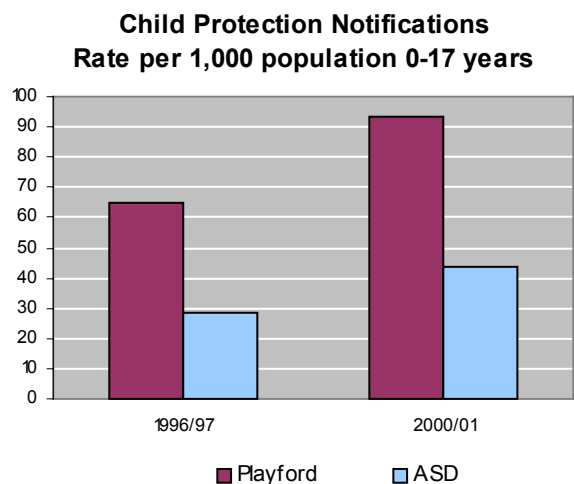


FAMILY HEALTH

Child Protection Notifications

In 2000/01 the number of notifications of child abuse in Playford was 93.2 per 1,000 population (0-17 year olds), more than double the rate in the metropolitan area.

Over the last 5 years, the number of notifications of child abuse has increased from 64.9 to 93.2 per 1,000 population.

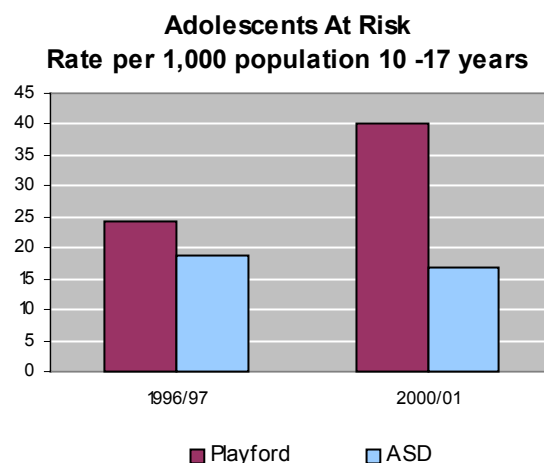


Adolescents at Risk

In 2000/01 there were twice as many adolescents (10-17 year olds) classified as being at risk in Playford than elsewhere in the metropolitan area. Adolescents were assessed as being at risk due to school problems, family conflict, runaways, drug & alcohol abuse, suicide, etc.

In Playford, 40.1 adolescents per 1,000 population were identified as being at risk compared with 16.9 in Adelaide.

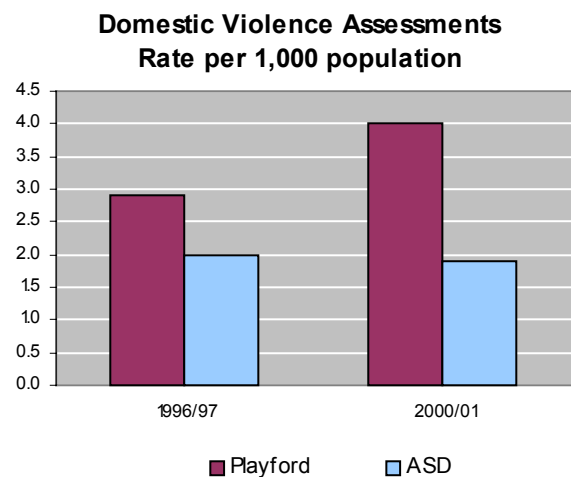
Over the last 5 years the rate at risk has increased from 24.2 to 40.1 per 1,000 adolescents. This is in contrast to the metropolitan area where the rate has dropped from 18.8 to 16.9 per 1,000 population.



Domestic Violence

The number of Domestic Violence Assessments in Playford rose from 2.9 per 1,000 population in 1996/97 to 4.0 in 2000/01.

In 2000/01, Playford residents were twice as likely to be assisted by FaYS through the Domestic Violence Program than residents living elsewhere in the metropolitan area (4.0 per 1,000 population compared with 1.9 in Adelaide).



CRIME

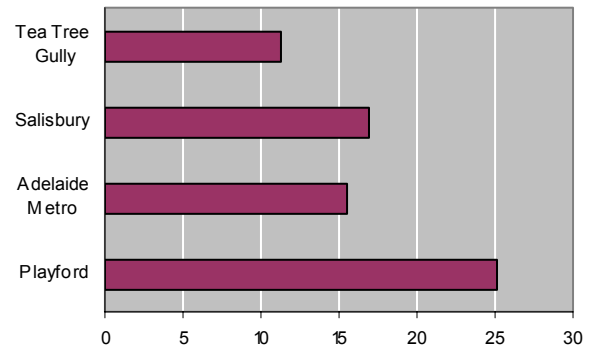
Offences against the person

Playford has the third highest rate of offences against the person, ranked behind Adelaide City and Port Adelaide/Enfield.

Within the northern suburbs, Playford ranks highest with 25 offences per 1,000 population compared with Salisbury (17) and Tea Tree Gully (11.3).

The metropolitan average was 15.5 offences per 1,000 population.

Rate per 1,000 population**

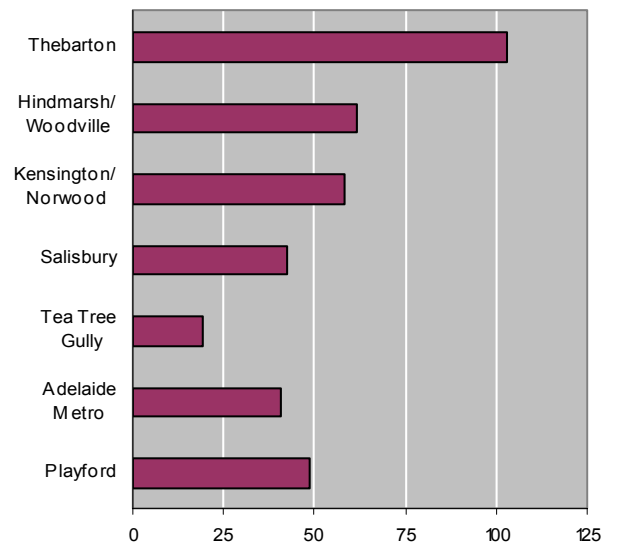


Break and Enter offences

The rate of break and enter dwelling offences in Playford was 48 offences per 1,000 dwellings, compared with a metropolitan average of 41.

Playford ranks 12th highest in the rate of break and enter offences across the metropolitan area.

Rate per 1,000 dwellings**

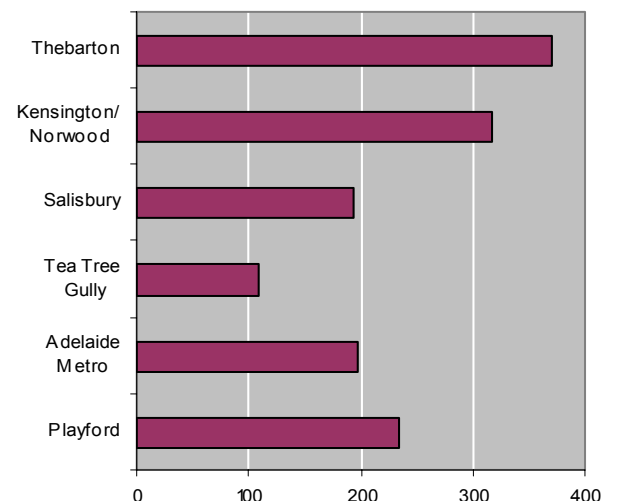


All offences

Playford ranks 6th highest of all LGA's in the overall offence rate with 234 offences per 1,000 population. This compares with a metropolitan average of 196 offences.

Within the Northern suburbs Playford ranks highest followed by Salisbury at 193 offences and Tea Tree Gully at 109.

AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION

Agricultural Production

The number of businesses engaged in agricultural activity in Playford increased from 262 in 1996 to 289 in 2000.

During this time the total value of agricultural commodities produced fluctuated between \$44.6m and \$69.5m.

In 2000, Playford accounted for 29% of the total value of agricultural production in the Adelaide metropolitan area, and 1.9% of agricultural production across SA.

The only metropolitan LGA that produced a greater agricultural output was Onkaparinga representing 34% of the metropolitan's total output.

Of the \$55.9m agricultural output produced in Playford in 2001, \$42.8m (77%) was generated from crops production, and \$13.1m was generated from livestock & livestock products.

Value of Agricultural Commodities Produced (\$m)



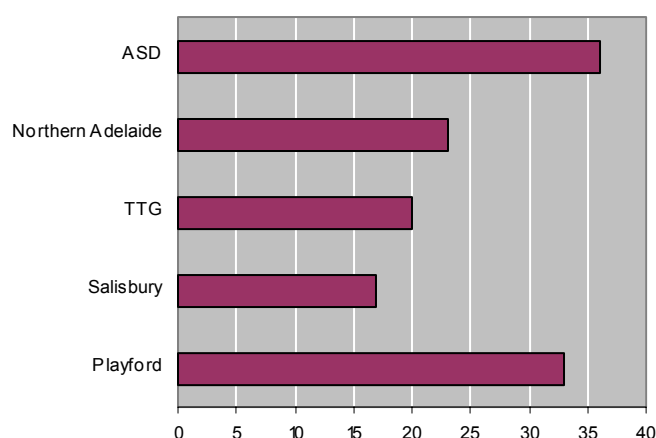
NEW MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATIONS

New Motor Vehicle Registrations

In 2001 there were 2,270 new motor vehicles registered in Playford, almost double the number of registrations 5 years ago (1,252).

The number of new vehicle registrations per 1,000 population in 2001 was 33, slightly lower than the metropolitan average of 36.

GLOSSARY

Adolescents At Risk	Adolescents at Risk are those young people between the ages of 12-17 years who come to the attention of FaYS and are at risk of negative outcomes due to homelessness, substance misuse, mental health issues and disconnection from the family.
Age Pension	A FaCS payment for people who have reached retirement age. To qualify for the Age Pension a male must be aged 65 years while the age at which a female may qualify depends upon her birth date. The qualifying age for females is being increased gradually to 65 years between 1 July 1995 and 2013.
Bachelor Degree or Higher	Includes Postgraduate Degree, Graduate Diploma, Graduate Certificate and Bachelor Degree.
Child Protection Notifications	Child Protection Notifications consist of contacts made to an authorised department by persons or other bodies making allegations of child abuse or neglect, child maltreatment or harm to a child.
Certificate Qualification	Includes Certificate I, II, III and IV qualifications.
Crude Birth Rate	The crude birth rate is the number of live births registered during the calendar year, per 1,000 estimated residential population at 30 June of that year.
Crude Death Rate	The crude death rate is the number of deaths registered during the calendar year, per 1,000 estimated residential population at 30 June of that year.
Diploma Qualification	Includes Advanced Diploma, Associate Degree and Diploma qualifications.
Disability Support Pension	A FaCS payment for people who are unable to work full time at full award wages owing to a substantial physical, intellectual or psychiatric impairment, or who are permanently blind. To qualify for the Disability Support Pension a person must be aged 16 years or over and not have reached Aged Pension age.
Domestic Violence	Domestic Violence program is predominantly for women (and other family members) who seek assistance from FaYS as a result of spousal violence or other family violence and have high needs such as accommodation and financial assistance.
Estimated Residential Population	The estimated residential population (ERP) of an area is the estimate of the number of persons who usually reside in that area irrespective of where they were on the date of enumeration.

GLOSSARY

Infant Mortality	The Infant Mortality Rate is the number of deaths of infants under 1 year of age per 1,000 liveborn babies (livebirths) in the same year. The figures reflect the place of residence of the mother at the time of the babies birth.
Labour Force	For any group, persons who were employed or unemployed.
Labour Force Participation Rate	For any group, the labour force expressed as a percentage of the population aged 15 years and over in the same group.
Mature Age Allowance	A FaCS payment that provides assistance to older, long term unemployed people aged 60 years and over, but below the Age Pension age.
Median Individual Income	The median individual income is the income value where 50% of the population aged 15 years and over have an income less than the median and 50% have an income greater than the median.
Newstart Allowance	A FaCS payment for working aged persons who are unemployed, aimed at ensuring recipients participate in activities designed to help their employment prospects. From September 1996, job search allowance and what was then known as Newstart allowance were combined into a single payment called Newstart allowance.
Unemployment Rate	For any group, the number of unemployed persons expressed as a percentage of the labour force in the same group.
Value of Agricultural Commodities Produced	The value of agricultural commodities produced is the gross value placed on recorded production at wholesale prices realised in the market place.
Youth Allowance	This FaCS payment was introduced by the Federal Government on 1 July 1998 to provide income support to young people who are studying, looking for work, or who are sick. Youth Allowance replaces AUSTUDY for 16 to 24 year olds, Newstart Allowance and Sickness Allowance for under 21 year olds, and Youth Training Allowance for 16 to 17 year olds. It also replaces Family Payment for 16 to 18 year old secondary students.
